

Traditional School and District Report Cards

Districts and schools report information for the Ohio School Report Cards on specific measures within six broader components. The components are Achievement, Progress, Gap Closing, Early Literacy, Graduation, and College, Career, Workforce and Military (CCWM) Readiness. Districts and schools earn a star rating on the components and an overall star rating. This helps give Ohio parents and schools a snapshot of the quality of education they are providing to students. Career Technical Planning District Report Card

The Career-Technical Planning District Report Cards include specific marks of performance, called measures, within broad categories called components. They receive grades for up to six measures and four components. The Career-Technical Planning District Report Cards also include federal reporting required by the federal Perkins V law. The complete technical document for the CTPD Report Card walks through each component and calculation.

Dropout Prevention and Recovery Report Cards

Community schools that serve a majority of their students through dropout prevention and recovery programs receive the dropout prevention and recovery report card. The dropout prevention and recovery report card has four components and uses three ratings for each measure – Exceeds Standards, Meets Standards, or Does Not Meet Standards. Report Cards are designed to give parents, communities, educators and policymakers information about the performance of districts and schools — to celebrate achievement and success and identify areas for improvement. The information provides clear and easily available reporting on student performance, drives local conversations on school improvement and identifies schools to receive supports for getting better. The goal is to ensure all students receive an excellent education hat can lead to success in life, careers and future learning.

The Ohio General Assembly amended Ohio's accountability law in the summer of 2021. Schools and districts now receive star ratings for five components. The report cards for the 2021-2022 school year will not include an overall rating, but one will be added when the 2023 report cards are released in the fall of that year. Additional nformation on the changes to the accountability system can be found on the Department's **Report Card Resources webpage**.

Report cards are only one part of the story about what is happening in schools and districts. To get a more complete picture, we encourage you to visit schools, talk o educators, parents and students, and review the school's or district's webpage. About Ohio EVAAS

Ohio's Value-Added component measures and evaluates the impact schools and teachers have on their students' academic progress. Value-added measures student growth, not whether the student is proficient on the state assessment. The Education Value-added Assessment System (EVAAS) uses the Ohio value-added measure to produce interactive reports that help educators evaluate practices and implement programs that best meet the needs of their students, as well as make informed decisions about where to focus resources to ensure growth opportunities for all students.

Comparison Reports

These reports allow for comparison of schools and districts across the state, and include interactive reports for selecting the data of interest.


